Guidelines and Application

THE PROGRAM

The Toni L. Cameron Memorial Performing Arts Scholarship Program was established by Rosa Foundation International to assist high school students who are pursuing higher education in the performing arts field to include dance, art, theatre, film production, music, or other genre.

While a student at James B. Dudley High School, Toni was an original Pantherette, a ballet dancer with the Greensboro Civic Ballet Company, Thespian, Panther's Claw Editor, Miss Varsity, National Honor Society member and a proud 1968 member of "The Class of the Impossible Dream." She graduated with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Dance and Dramatic Arts from Boston Conservatory.

In her memory, Rosa Foundation Scholarship Committee takes great pride in announcing an award to those high school students who plan to continue their education at an institution of higher learning in the performing arts industry. All applications for awards shall be governed by the guidelines stated below.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants for the scholarship award must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Be high school seniors who will graduate in the current year
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Accepted and enrolled in a full-time course of study at an accredited college, university, a community college, or a trade/vocational school program.

<u>AWARD</u>

If selected as a recipient, the student will receive a one-time \$1000.00 scholarship award. A check will be made payable to the institution once the full-time course of study at an accredited college, university, community college, or a trade/vocational school program has been verified by Rosa Foundation Scholarship Committee.

Application must be post marked no later than <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 1</u>, <u>2022</u>. Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information. Applications are evaluated on the information submitted to Rosa Foundation Scholarship Committee; therefore, answer all questions as completely as possible. Incomplete applications will not be considered for evaluation. <u>Only</u> Rosa Foundation Scholarship Committee will review and evaluate applicant's information received.

SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS FOR AWARD

Rosa Foundation Scholarship Committee will select recipient(s) for scholarship awards. Scholarship recipient(s) are selected on the basis of academic record, future potential, and participation in school and community activities, in addition to a statement of career and educational aspirations and goals, and letters of recommendations. To ensure that no bias occurs in the selection process for award of scholarships, all interested applicants (high school seniors) must meet the criteria established in the guidelines and application of the program.

As an internal quality control measure, Rosa Foundation Scholarship Committee selects recipient(s) for scholarship awards based on the criteria listed above. All applicants agree to accept the decision of the committee. Scholarship awards will be presented at the Men Making Positive Changes Award Ceremony.

RECEIPT OF SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Once the scholarship award has been presented, a copy of the letter of acceptance and proof of enrollment (copy of fall semester class schedule) needs to be submitted to the committee before the start of the incoming semester. Once received, a check will be mailed to the institution.
